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Articulation And Phonological Disorders Speech

Articulation disorders focus on errors (e.g., distortions and substitutions) in production of individual speech sounds. Phonological disorders focus on predictable, rule-based errors (e.g., fronting, stopping, and final consonant deletion) that affect more than one sound.

Speech problems – articulation and phonological disorders
Articulation and phonology (fon-ol-oji) refer to the way sound is produced. A child with an articulation disorder has problems forming speech sounds properly. A child with a phonological disorder can produce the sounds correctly, but may use them in the wrong place.

Speech problems - articulation and phonological disorders

The phonological or phonemic level is the brainwork that organizes the speech sounds into the sound patterns to be produced. The sounds need to contrast with each other, or be distinct from one another, so that we can make sense when we talk. Articulation (phonetic) disorder is a speech sound disorder that affects the PHONETIC level. The child has difficulty saying particular consonants and vowels.

Articulation and Phonological Disorders (Speech Sound Disorders) Speech sound disorders (SSD) include articulation disorders, in which a child has trouble physically producing a sound or sounds, and phonological disorders (also known as phonological process disorders), in which the child produces set patterns of sound errors.

The broad term "speech sound disorder(s)" is used in this Portal page to refer to functional speech sound disorders, including those related to the motor production of speech sounds (articulation) and those related to the linguistic aspects of speech production (phonological). It is often difficult to cleanly differentiate between articulation and phonological errors or to differentially diagnose these two separate disorders.

An articulation error is specific to a particular speech sound. A phonological disorder is a simplification of the sound system that results in patterned speech sound errors. An articulation disorder refers to problems making sounds. Young children often make speech errors.

Articulation and Phonology | Katz Speech

Articulation refers to the production of speech sounds. An individual with an articulation delay or disorder can be hard to understand because they produce sounds incorrectly. He may substitute one sound for another, e.g., "I like wed" for "I like red" and/or distort the sound so it is still recognizable as the same sound but sounds different.

Articulation and phonological disorders are difficulties producing speech sounds or groups of speech sounds that persist beyond the typical period of speech development and/or result in difficulty understanding speech. 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Both CAS and phonological disorders fall under a greater umbrella known as Speech-Sound Disorders. Within this group are two smaller subgroups. These are articulation disorders and phonemic disorders.

Difference in Apraxia & a Phonological Disorder - Great Speech

A phonological processing disorder affects a child's production and/or mental representation of speech sounds. A phonological disorder is commonly misdiagnosed as an articulation disorder; however, it is very different. A phonological disorder affects how a child organizes the sounds and understands the speech rules of a language.

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Speech sound disorders are the inability to correctly form the sounds of words. Speech sound disorders also include articulation disorder, disfluency, and voice disorders. Children with phonological disorder do not use some or all of the speech sounds to form words as expected for a child their age.
