The purposes of assessments are to support learning, identify special needs, evaluate a program, monitor trends, and serve high stakes accountability requirements. The NEGP recommends that standardized assessments for high stakes purposes not be administered until grade 3 and preferably not until grade 4 (Shepard, et al., 1998).
