In June 1982, the Supreme Court issued Plyler v. Doe, a landmark decision holding that states cannot constitutionally deny students a free public education on account of their immigration status.

Public Education for Immigrant Students: Understanding ...

States cannot deny public education to any K-12 student, regardless of immigration status. Under current federal law , all students in your school have a legal right to be there. The teacher's challenge is to look after students' well-being and psychological safety: Toward that end, they need to be regularly reminded that they belong in your classroom, and they are safe with you.

Under Federal law, States and local educational agencies are obligated to provide all children - regardless of immigration status - with equal access to public education at the elementary and secondary level. This includes children such as unaccompanied children who may be involved in immigration proceedings.
